South Fulton Institute 2023 Partner Announcement

ATLANTA, GA: South Fulton Institute is pleased to announce **Create: Partner Program 2023**: a one-year partnership program producing art projects envisioned by artists and organizations. Twenty-Eight selected projects operating within South Fulton and representing artistic excellence in film, theatre, dance, photography, and music will partner with the South Fulton Institute to present new and exciting projects and events that benefit the cultural and artistic landscape of South Fulton County.

By expanding the Create: Partner Program in 2021 and moving from a closed-network application to an open application structure, SFI has increased the diversity and engagement of individuals, schools, and nonprofit organizations in this year's program. "SFI is honored to support and acknowledge these 28 artists, organizations, and schools as creative partners," said **Jennifer Bauer Lyons, SFI Executive Director.** "As an organization that supports arts & arts education we are excited to partner on projects that engage teaching artists or artists that connects the community to learn about different cultures. Our goal is to increase access to high-quality, free programming for South Fulton and Metro Atlanta residents and communities."

In addition to facilitating vital connections between artists, organizations, and schools, SFI offers pro-bono consulting and mentors to address the individual needs of Create Program Partners and provides critical resources and tools such as fundraising, marketing, program design, communication strategy, and financial management resources to the local emerging artist. "The support of SFI in making this documentary allowed me an opportunity to work with filmmakers in my community and the space to document a Black woman artist with resources and intention." said Ebony Blanding, 2022 SFI Filmer filmmaker.

The Create Partner Program application process is open to any individual and nonprofit organization with an arts-related project that can connect to the South Fulton County Region. Applicants are not required to be South Fulton residents, but projects must enhance the art community in the South Fulton County region. The open application, reviewed annually, finds its most successful applications significantly impact the South Fulton County cities of

Chattahoochee Hills, College Park, City of South Fulton, East Point, Fairburn, Hapeville, Palmetto, and Union City.
